



## **Enrollment by Session**








#### **Gender Trends - Graded Enrollment**




#### **Semester-to-Semester Persistence Rates**

The proportion of students new to the college in the fall who re-enroll at the college for the subsequent spring and fall semesters.




Successful Course Completion Rates by Type of Course Fall 1997 – Fall 2001







# Student Success in Moving from Developmental to College-Level English and Math Courses

#### Fall 1991 - 1995 Starting Cohorts

The three bars represent the progress of students from developmental to college-level English courses, representing the percentage of students who were enrolled at the indicated level in the given fall semester and had enrolled in a higher level course by the Spring 2002 semester. Thus, the first bar indicates the percentage of students enrolled in the most basic C level course (English 81A or 81B) in the given semester who later enrolled in an intermediate B level course (English 21A, 21B, or 22), with the latest cohorts showing that more than half of the students in the C level later enrolled in a B level course. The middle bar indicates the percent of students who were enrolled in a C level course during the indicated semester who had enrolled in the A Level ("English Composition" – English 1) course by Spring 2002. This proportion has remained at approximately 30%. Finally, the third bar indicates the proportion of students who were enrolled in a B Level course in the given semester and later enrolled in English Composition (Level A). This proportion remained between 50% and 60% for the five cohorts examined.


The same process is followed in the math courses, with Math 81, 84, 31, and 32 as the C level courses; Math 20 as the B level course, and Math 2, 7, 21, 23, and 52 as the A level courses. As with the English courses, a higher proportion of students advance one level than two levels, but the percentages never exceed 50%.







#### **Student Services Survey Responses**

In Spring 2003, surveys measuring student perceptions of SMC student services were distributed in 55 randomly selected academic and vocational classes and through 18 student services offices.
