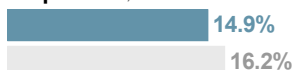

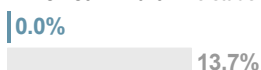

How much of the 2010 entering class was included in the graduation rate?

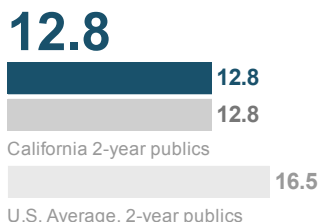

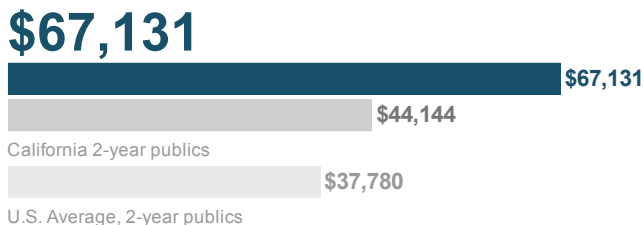
Completions per 100 students

It's the three-year average for 2011, 2012, and 2013, and includes all undergraduate students, not only the first-time, full-time ones.
