**SMC Migration to Canvas Information
(Tuesday, May 3 from 11:15a to 12:30p in BUS 144)**

This is a repeat workshop for faculty who missed the Canvas Migration session during the spring flex day. Topics include an overview of Canvas, sample courses and an update on where SMC is at in the migration process. Information about training opportunities will be provided ending with time for Q&A.

**Manual Course Migration Workshop
(Tuesday, May 17 from 11:15a to 12:30p in BUS 255)**

This is a hands-on workshop for faculty who have completed either the @One or the SMC Introduction to Canvas course. This workshop will focus on how to start with a blank Canvas shell and manually migrate content from eCollege and is especially targeted to faculty who did not get content migrated over for their summer and fall online/hybrid courses.

**Canvas 101 Introduction Workshop
(Friday, May 20 from 9:00a to 12:00p in BUS 253)**

This hands-on workshop is designed for faculty who would like a face-to-face introduction to the Canvas platform. No prior experience using Canvas is required. Participants will create a Canvas sandbox to explore topics such as the Canvas interface, settings and navigation. Topics also include creating modules, pages, discussions, quizzes and assignments in Canvas.

**Canvas 201 Advanced Workshop for Canvas 101 Graduates
(Friday, May 20 from 9:00a to 12:00p in BUS 259)**

This is a hands-on workshop for faculty who have completed either the @One or the SMC Introduction to Canvas course. The purpose of this workshop is to provide a lab environment for faculty to work on preparing their Canvas course shells for the upcoming summer and fall terms. Faculty will work with the assistance of peer mentors to get their courses ready after having been scraped over from the eCollege platform into Canvas. Additional topics include using resources such as Respondus, 3C Media and external apps.
