Sabbatical FAQs

What are Sabbaticals?

A sabbatical is a one semester project for full-time faculty that takes the place of one semester of teaching and is intended to improve instruction.

"Sabbaticals are intended to improve instruction; therefore, a wide variety of sabbatical programs will be considered, such as, institutional research, travel, independent study, and industrial research" (Board Policy 7341).

Who can apply? and when am I eligible?

Tenured faculty members may apply during or after their **sixth consecutive year of full-time service** for a first sabbatical leave to take place in the following academic year. During or after their sixth consecutive year of full-time service following a sabbatical leave, faculty members may apply for a subsequent sabbatical to take place in the following academic year. A year of full-time service is defined as 75% of the days in an academic year and 100% of the regular assignment.

Specifically, **if you started your teaching full-time at SMC in 16-17**, you are eligible to apply. **If you took a sabbatical in 15-16 or before**, you are eligible to apply. (Note, if you took an unpaid personal leave, your 6 years starts over when you return to teaching full-time)

Will I lose retirement or step advancement?

No, you will continue to accrue retirement, and you will continue to advance in your steps as if you were working normally

working normally.

Can I work overload during a sabbatical?

No, you cannot work overload assignments during a sabbatical.

Fellowship FAQs

What are Fellowships?

One semester projects related to new course development, course materials development, or research related to teaching or student services within the faculty member's area of discipline expertise, for which you will receive \$1500.

How do Fellowships work?

How much work should a Fellowship encompass?

The Faculty Association uses \$65 per hour to calculate work done beyond our teaching assignments. So, if your proposal is all your own time, 23.5 hours will cover the \$1500.
