### **Review and Approval of Minutes**

### **Chair's Report**

After attending the Senate Executive meeting, Frank Dawson reports of the committee voting member's selection process. There has to be a 2 to 1 administrator to faculty ratio. The committee will have six (6) voting members with the chair being one of those voters but does not need to participate and his/her vote cannot be replaced by anyone else's. The committee suggested that voting members should be familiar with the Perkins process and each subcommittee within CTE should have a chair that is in turn a voting member. Frank Dawson is to put a list of preliminary voting members together.

### **Continuing Discussions**

Subcommittees are to review and look at disciplines by examining existing curriculum, seeing where's there are duplications of disciplines, what degrees and certificates are offered, and where jobs exist. The committee suggested combining some of the sub committees such as the High School subcommittee with Outreach/Marketing, possibly calling the UXD committee "Curriculum Development", and or possibly adding a New Program Development subcommittee to assist with the Chancellor's Office curriculum process. Because there are many possible intersections and conversations it was suggested to use software called "Base Camp" that allows you to have online track able conversations and invite others to be observers.

User Experience Design (UXD) is seen as the initial project to be attempted under ICTE. ICTE is clearly to align certificates and degrees with jobs but the committee should also attempt to strategize with what works across programs. The SMC Foundation is compiling a list of potential advisory board (potential employers) members for the ICTE initiative.
