

AB 1505 : Faculty Obligation Number

What Is A "Faculty Obligation Number"

- The Faculty Obligation Number was instituted in conjunction with AB 1725 (Vasconcellos) in 1988
- The FON was created to ensuring that colleges at a minimum increased their number of full-time faculty workforce in proportion to their growth in credit FTES
- Annually, the Board of Governors "triggers the FON" when it determines whether or not the state budget has provided colleges with resources adequate to implement the regulation
 - Increases in the FON in times of growth are reversed in times of revenue decline.
- Specifically, The California Code of Regulations (CCR), Title 5 Section 51025 requires community college districts to increase their base number of full-time faculty over the prior year in proportion to the amount of growth in funded credit FTES.

As Of Fall 2022

AB 1505 (Rodriguez)

- Co-Sponsored By FACCC Faculty Association of CA Community Colleges
- This bill would require the Board of Governors to adopt regulations that require the Fall of 2023 Full-time Faculty Obligation Number for each community college district to be set to the actual full-time faculty number reported for the fall of 2022 and annually adjusted pursuant to these regulations.
- Status: Unanimously Passed The State Assembly. Now In The State Senate
