Q1: What made these sessions successful for you?

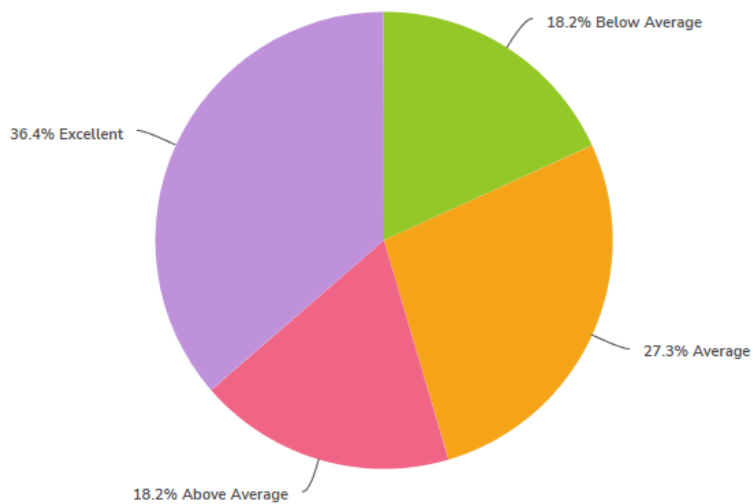

After hearing how successful these sessions were for the SMC community, it sounds like the sessions delivered in very positive and productive ways! We did ask the question “if we could improve any sessions offered, where or what could we improve?” and there were no specific comments related to the two sessions in this question.
