Dear Colleagues,

A Counseling Subcommittee has been formed to address the administrative regulations on Probation, Dismissal and Readmission policies. In looking to revise our regulations we have requested data and are beginning to review SMC's and other community colleges intervention strategies that specifically address these particular student populations.

We are now coming to you to solicit your help. We know that what Melissa, her team and our special programs are doing is working, yet we need to specifically know what those interventions are and figure out how to scale them up or how to offer specific information or strategies in different formats or platforms. What do you believe is working in your interventions with students on probation or disqualification status? What could we add to or do differently to help improve success rates especially for our Latino and African American student's?

The data shows that only about 23.5% of students on probation attend BTS sessions while these same students who attend also demonstrate improvement in their GPA's in the subsequent semester. The data also shows that Latino students are the student population less likely to attend a BTS session. We also know that students using GPS persisted at a higher rate. Knowing this information, and of course knowing the great work that you each do with your students, we are asking for any and all ideas in providing targeted services/interventions to these student populations.

We would very much appreciate it if you can please take a few minutes to answer the survey questions in the document attached? If you have any other suggestions or questions, please email me directly.
