## New Courses— Credit

1. INTARC 54: Universal Design for Interiors—presented by Denise Travis and Sheila Cordova. This course studies the practical design and modification of homes to provide basic universal access and criteria for people of all ages, throughout their lifetime, while incorporating style and a cost effective budget. Students analyze accessibility, usability and visitability features of various residential spaces, and learn to make informed decisions of the design features and specifications of home materials for client lifelong, easy independent living.

Helen LeDonne moved to approve INTARC 54 with the following changes:

- On the Course Approval and Data Sheet and Course Outline:
  - Change the first sentence to read: "In this course students will study the. . ."
  - Change the last sentence to read: ". . .materials for lifelong, easy, independent living for clients."

The motion passed unanimously.

Approval of the Prerequisite for INTARC 54: INTARC 32.

Mary Lynne Stephanou moved to approve the prerequisite. The motion passed unanimously.

2. KIN PE 46: Performance Cheerleading—presented by Anna Collier. This course is designed to develop the performance-level cheerleading skills and routines. The course provides a consistent laboratory for the development and enhancement of the skills required to participate in cheerleading. The improvement of cardiovascular fitness, muscular strength, and flexibility will be necessary for the high performance of cheerleading. Performance, safety, and cooperation will be emphasized in the course. Students will perform at selected athletic events as a team.

Helen LeDonne moved to approve KIN PE 46 with the following changes:

- > On the Course Approval and Data Sheet:
  - #5 Printed Catalog and Class Schedule Description –Make the same change on the Course Outline of Record. Change the course description to read: "This course is designed to develop performance-level cheerleading skills and routines. The course provides a consistent laboratory for the development and enhancement of the skills required to participate in cheerleading and improvement of cardiovascular fitness, muscular strength, and flexibility. Performance, safety, and cooperation will be emphasized in the course. Students will perform at selected athletic events as a team."
  - #11 Should this course be repeatable Number of times should read "3."

#### (New Courses cont.)

3. Math 54: Elementary Statistics—presented by Mario Martinez. This course covers concepts and procedures of descriptive statistics, elementary probability theory and inferential statistics. Course material includes: summarizing data in tables and graphs; computation of descriptive statistics; measures of central tendency; variation; percentiles; sample spaces; classical probability theory; rules of probability; probability distributions; binomial, normal, T, Chi-square and F distributions; making inferences; decisions and predictions. This course develops confidence intervals for population parameters, hypothesis testing for both one and two populations, correlation and regression, ANOVA, test for independence and non-parametric method. This course develops statistical thinking through the study of applications in variety of disciplines. The use of a statistical/graphing calculator or statistical analysis software is integrated into the course.

Randy Lawson moved to approve Math 54 with the following changes:
