**New Courses—** Credit:

1. Anthropology 08: Urban Languages—presented by Sohini Ray and Eric Minzenberg. The purpose of this course is to introduce students to the study of language communities in metropolitan areas with examples ranging from multiple urban centers across the world including Asia, the United States, Europe, Latin America and African cities using an issuebased comparative approach. The study of urban linguistic communities provides crucial insights on how language is used to construct communities and nations. The course readings and exercises focus on some of the language varieties, communication styles and multicultural experiences common to urban areas in many countries of the world. The course also emphasizes the global interconnectedness between different urban groups across the world through the use of media and the Internet, namely adolescent groups and activist groups based on gender, ethnicity or cultural issues. The course uses the example of languages and/or its multiple dialects to illustrate some of the complex historical and anthropological implications of how language communities function in society.

Randy Lawson moved to send the Anthropology 8 course and the Global Citizenship request back to the department for changes. The motion passed with 14 yes votes and 2 abstentions.
