Pre-requisite of Math 20

There was extensive discussion, arising from concern that Math 20 (Pre-College Level: Intermediate Algebra) will not adequately prepare students for success in CS 30. Overwhelmingly, the prerequisite for MATLAB courses is Calculus I (two levels higher than Math 20). The Committee made a decision to vote on the prerequisite, contingent on these concerns and the options of teaching CS 30 at a level appropriate for the Math 20 pre-requisite, increasing the pre-requisite to Math 2(Pre-Calculus) or Math 7 (Calculus I), being communicated to the presenters. The second two options would require further Curriculum Committee action.
