SMC's completion rates are low

Only 7.1% of incoming freshmen (non-F1) in Fall 2013 completed a degree or certificate within three years (by 2015-2016)

The rate only slightly improves (by 4%) when tracking completion for four years (2016-2017)



Low-income

53% received need-based financial aid

63% enrolled in fewer than 12 units

48% Black, Hispanic, or Native American








Accumulation of 30+ College Units (grade D or better) in First Year

First-time Freshmen in Fall 2015 (No F1 International Students), N = 5056




Earned 30+ College Units by Ethnicity/Race






Accumulation of 15+ College Units (grade D or better) in First Year

39.5% of incoming freshmen in Fall 2015 earned 15 or more degree-applicable units in their first year. At this pace, these students can complete a 60 unit associate degree in four years

Ethnicity/Race



Completion of College English (1 or higher) and Math (20 or higher) in First Year


Completed College English and

Math in First Year


First-time Freshmen in Fall 2015 (No F1 International Students), N = 5056



18.6% of incoming freshmen in Fall 2015 completed (with grade of D or better) both English 1 and an associate degree applicable math or higher (Math 20 or higher) in the first year of enrollment.
