# 3-A CONTRACT FOR 2003 HISPANIC ASSOCIATION OF COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES (HACU) CONFERENCE

Contract with The Doubletree Guest Suites, Santa Monica, as the site for the 2003 HACU Conference, which will be hosted by Santa Monica College at this location, May 7-9, 2003. Under this contract, The Doubletree will provide guest rooms, and services related to the implementation of the conference for an amount not to exceed \$21,500.

Funding Source: HACU\*DOL/ETA Workforce Development Initiative

Sub-Grant Award (\$30,000)

Comment:

Santa Monica College is one of two colleges to receive the HACU\*DOL/ETA Workforce Development Initiative Sub-Grant Award to host a Hispanic Association of Colleges and Universities national conference in 2003. (Texas A & M University is the other recipient). The conference targets educational institutions, community organizations and governmental agencies that are at the forefront of issues involving workforce development.

The theme of the Santa Monica conference is Innovative Opportunities: Strategic Partnership for Excellence in Workforce Development, and the event will emphasize 3 key principles:

- Connecting public/non profit agencies with higher education
- Insuring youth workforce training that has strong educational programming, and
- Building families by working with community-based and faith-based organizations.

To support the achievement of these principles, conference activities, workshops and presentations will be designed to provide participants with creative strategies and best practices in a variety of areas, including: Grant Development, Technology Effective Partnerships Between WorkSource Centers and Community Colleges, and Youth Training.

# 3-B CONSULTANT FOR HACU CONFERENCE COORDINATION

Consultant contract with Jennifer Asquith to provide coordination of activities related to the implementation of the Hispanic Association of Colleges and Universities (HACU) Conference that will be held on May 7-9 2003, for an amount not to exceed \$7,000. The period of the contract is from February 11-May 23, 2003.

**Sub-Grant Award** 

Comment: Ms. Asquith's duties will include central coordination of activities

required for implementation of the HACU Conference, including registration of conference participants, coordinating details with conference hotel and exhibitors, keeping track of budgeted expenses, and coordinating VIP/guest speaker needs. Jennifer Asquith has 9 years experience in the field of Event Planning, and

has coordinated events ranging from 10-20,000 attendees.

### 3-C CONTRACT WITH SANTA MONICA-MALIBU UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT

Contract with the Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District for the development and delivery of customized staff training in Early Childhood Education. The period of the contract is from February 11-June 30, 2003 for the amount of \$15, 000.

Lili Claire Foundation

Comment: Santa Monica College will develop a specialized curriculum for

two courses each consisting of 16 instructional hours to train paraprofessionals who work with children with disabilities in elementary grades. Scheduling of the training will accommodate the SMMUSD staff. Santa Monica College will select and purchase two sets of supplemental training materials, and one set will remain with the school district at the conclusion of the training

period.

Santa Monica Malibu Unified School District will be responsible for the selection of the participants and provide a location for the training. Textbooks for the courses will be furnished by the

SMMUSD for the participants.

# 3-D CONTRACT WITH CAREER PARTNERS, INC.

Contract with Career Partners, Inc. to train fifteen (15) students meeting the Workforce Investment Act (WIA) eligibility criteria. Whereas, on a dollar-per-student basis, there is great disparity in funding among California's community college districts; and

Whereas, the highest funded district receives more than \$8,000 per full-time-equivalent student and the lowest funded district receives less than \$3,000; the average amount received by the highest funded districts is \$5,693 per full-time-equivalent student, and the average amount received by the lowest funded districts is \$3,516 and the gap is growing larger; and

Whereas, when there are more state funds available to the community college system, higher-funded districts receive proportionately more and lower-funded districts receive proportionately less, and, conversely, when state funds are cut, higher-funded districts receive a smaller cut per student and lower-funded districts receive a larger cut per student, making the disparity in funding even worse, and

Whereas, the lack of equitable state funding means that students in lower-funded districts have significantly less access to classes, tutors, full-time instructors, lab technicians, math and writing center assistance, basic skills classes, adequately maintained facilities, instructional materials, current technology, technical programs, and counselors as well as other support staff for an increasingly diverse student population; and

Whereas, all of California's community college districts are required to comply with the same state mandates, but the resources that enable compliance vary widely district by district; and

Whereas, funding all community college programs and services on a per student basis would reduce the disparity in funding, increase access to equal education; and

Whereas, understanding California's current fiscal problems, the disparities in funding within the community college system must not be allowed to get worse;

**Therefore, be it resolved**, that the Board of Trustees of the Santa Monica Community College District supports funding on the basis of full-time equivalent students and:

- Urges a resolution to assure fair and equitable funding to all California community college districts, and
- Commits to actively advocate on behalf of comparable funding for **ALL** of the California community college districts on a per student basis.

Business Services provides to the Board of Trustees on a quarterly basis a complete set of financial statements for all funds along with the quarterly 311Q report required by the Chancellor's Office. This projection does not reflect the Governor's mid-year budget cuts.

#### **BUDGET NARRATIVE FOR MID-YEAR ADJUSTMENTS**

This narrative is to clarify the income projections shown in the December 31, 2002 financial statements for the General Fund. On January 10, 2003 the Governor proposed significant mid year budget cuts. As of February 5, 2003 the state has not approved the proposed budget cuts and a compromise resolution is not likely before the agenda goes to print. The information regarding the impact of the Governor's proposed cuts are projected in the final column (e) entitled 02/03 Governor's Mid Year. The (d) column is the projected annual income/expense before mid-year revenue budget cuts. On the next page – marked "Expenditures" column (e) is left blank. The administration has been having extensive meetings to determine the appropriate cuts that will need to be made.

#### Fund 01

In the Unrestricted General Fund (01) the Governor's mid-year column (e) cuts reduce our revenues by \$2.8 million dollars compared to projections in column (d). These reductions are shown in lines 3, 4, 9 and 10 – principal apportionment, basic skills, Partnership for Excellence, and other state income (including part-time faculty compensation). Column (d) includes a few other Fund 01 local income figures that have been adjusted to reflect our best estimates at this time and which are not affected by the Governor's cuts.

The projected expenditures for Fund 01 column (d) reflect actual expenditures plus the projection of expenditures for the balance of the fiscal year. Expenditure projections are almost \$0.9 million dollars greater than the adopted budget. This would leave the college with a negative ending balance if not handled by the end of the year. We now project that the cuts must also include the \$2.8 million that the Governor has proposed as revenue decreases. Therefore, the District must cut \$3.3 million in the General Fund Unrestricted to end the year with a balanced budget, but not reserves.

# Fund 03

The Restricted General Fund (03) reflects an increase of \$2.7 million in revenue above the 02/03 adopted budget. This increase is due to new grants being received and the inclusion of deferred revenue. However, the Governor has proposed \$1.7 million in cuts to the categorical state programs (Fund 03). The administrators and program managers are in the process of revising the categorical programs to adjust for the combined changes where possible.

# The bottom line is that the Governor has asked us to cut over \$5 million for the balance of this year in the General Fund.

Based on the Governor's proposal for 2003-04, Santa Monica College will see an additional \$7.6 million reduction to Fund 01 General Fund Unrestricted and an additional \$5.2 million reduction to Fund 03 General Fund Restricted. We are not the only community college that is affected by this unprecedented reduction in state funding. This will make securing alternate revenues more difficult since there will be many chasing few dollars. Our plan for reduction and recovery must consider where the state will be two and three years from now. Considering the devastating state cuts and our extremely low state revenue per FTE, we will be active at the state level to help develop a fair funding model that takes into consideration equity in state revenue per FTE. Presently we are funded at about 15% below the state average per FTE for large districts. Another area for special consideration is the international program at Santa Monica College which has been the single other source of unrestricted income that keeps the College functioning. It must be intensified as much as possible.
