IV. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

- Enrollment Report: Executive Vice President Randal Lawson reported that the college has achieved about 75 percent of its base recovery plan. It was noted that community colleges throughout the state are experiencing flat enrollments due, in part, to the state's decision to more than double fees over a two-year period.
- Recognition of Football Coach Robert Taylor: The Board presented football coach Robert Taylor with a commendation for his service to the college and students.
- Management Association Update/Classified Staff Recognition Award: Katharine Muller, president of the SMC Management Association, presented this month's Classified Staff Recognition Award to Jackie Portal-Purdy, administrative assistant at the Airport Campus, who has worked at SMC 19 years.
- Bundy Campus Update: Provost Marvin Martinez reported that work is progressing on developing a
 master plan for the Bundy campus, which is scheduled to open this summer. A master plan kickoff
 meeting for the college community will be held of Friday, February 25th at at 9 a.m. and a community
 meeting with Mar Vista neighbors will be held on Tuesday, March 15th at 7 p.m.
