

Remote Meetings Under the Brown Act (Gov't Code §54953)

Non-Emergency

- Each teleconference location identified in published agenda
- Each teleconference location shall be accessible to the public
- Public has the right address the body at each teleconference location
- A quorum of members must participate from locations with the jurisdiction's boundaries

Emergency

- A completely remote meeting can be held so long as public participation is ensured
- Agenda need not include location of where members are participating from or require public participation at each location
- No requirement that a quorum of members participate from locations with the jurisdiction's boundaries



Brown Act Bodies

The Board's monthly emergency resolution impacts a number of College bodies subject to the Brown Act, including:

- Board of Trustees
- Personnel Commission
- Academic Senate and its Committees
- DPAC and its committees
- Associated Students and its committees
- Bond Advisory Committee



Transition to In-Person Meetings

What will meetings look like in the future?

- For Board of Trustees meeting, should a remote option be available for the public?
