III. The minutes of the January 23, 2008 DPAC meeting were accepted.

IV. Reports

- A. Strategic Planning Task Force: At its last meeting, the Strategic Planning Task Force reviewed input from constituency groups on the Mission, Vision and Goals; reviewed and revised the Strategic Initiatives and worked on the presentation for Flex Day, March 4th.
- B. GASB 45 Task Force: Recommendations from GASB 45 Task Force were presented as part of this meeting's agenda (see V-A).
- C. Superintendent/President Response to DPAC Recommendations: None

D. Planning Subcommittees

- 1. Budget Planning: Mona Martin and Leroy Lauer, Co-Chairs: The Budget Planning Subcommittee met last week and received information on the P-1 report and an update on non-resident tuition. Benchmarks will be discussed at the next meeting.
- 2. College Services Planning: Charlie Yen and Connie Lemke, Co-Chairs. The College Services Planning Subcommittee continues to work on the proposals for food vending contracts. As a result of concerns raised by the subcommittee regarding a slowdown of the process, the following statement was presented to DPAC.

The DPAC subcommittee on College Services hereby notifies DPAC that there has a slow down and unexplainable obstacles impeding the progress of our committee's work. We are concerned that the scope of notification is insufficient and that the mandate for the required site visit may inhibit the pool of vendors. There must be additional site visits and advertisements in the LA Times and other publications. We are extremely concerned that this slowdown is thwarting our mission.

Keith Webster, Director of Purchasing, provided an update on the request for proposal process for the food services vending contracts. Of the 16 vendors who expressed an interest, 8 participated in the walkthrough. It was suggested that Keith meet with the College Services Planning Subcommittee for further discussion of the process, and the issue can come back to DPAC, if necessary. A report by the College Services Planning Subcommittee will be scheduled for the next DPAC meeting.

- 3. Facilities Planning: Greg Brown and Lee Peterson, Co-Chairs. Celebrate American will not be held at SMC this year because of the Corsair Field project. The Facilities Planning Subcommittee is discussing how to develop a priority list for facilities projects. The next meeting will include discussion about the organic garden project, designated smoking areas, and the SM City Council's planned changes for traffic and parking.
- 4. Human Resources Planning: Pat Brown and Lesley Kawaguchi, Co-Chairs. The Human Resources Planning Subcommittee is discussing campus safety and workplace violence, is moving ahead with revisions to AR 3121, and is discussing professional development opportunities for classified staff.
- 5. Technology Planning: Bob Dammer and Simon Balm, Co-Chairs. No report

E. Academic Senate Joint Committees

- 1. Curriculum: Mary Colavito, Chair and Georgia Lorenz, Vice-Chair: The Curriculum Committee will be discussing a global citizenship A.A. requirement at the next meeting.
- 2. Program Review: Janet Harclerode/Melody Nightingale, Chairs and Katharine Muller, Vice-Chair: The Program Review Committee met with three programs that submitted self-studies, and will be meeting with 11

- departments/programs in the spring. The focus will be on making sure that SLOs are integrated into the programs and courses. A full report will be presented at the end of the academic year.
- 3. Student Affairs: Jose Cue, Chair and Judy Penchansky, Vice-Chair: The Student Affairs Committee is reviewing administrative regulations dealing with mandatory assessment, progress and academic renewal, withdrawal, and grade changes.

Associated Students: Heidi Hoeck: The Associated Students are working on revising the constitution to add a Director of Sustainability, trying to change the election process to be anti-slate and more democratic, promoting an "educational awareness" food campaign and leading a panel on flex day on sustainability.

A., The GASB 45 Task Force submitted the following recommendation for consideration by DPAC.

The GASB 45 Task Force recommends that the Santa Monica Community College District begin to pre-fund its retiree health benefits obligation. The Task Force recommends an initial contribution of \$1.4 million and subsequent annual contributions in the amount of \$500,000 over the next four fiscal years. The Task Force also recommends that the College's initial contribution be drawn from the SCCCD (Southern California Community College District) JPA and placed in an irrevocable trust. Lastly, the Task Force also recommends that at the end of the stated five-year period, the District re-evaluate its retiree health benefits liability.
