B. Discussion of Projection Accuracy

The Committee discussed the differences between the Adopted and Actual Budget and what, if anything, could be done to improve the District's financial projections.

C. Potential Trigger Cut Reductions

Chris Bonvenuto shared information from the Chancellor's office about the potential trigger cuts enacted into the state budget this year. According to the Chancellor's office worksheet, Santa Monica College faces \$602K in Tier 1 cuts and \$1.446M in Tier 2 cuts. Fiscal Services believes its slightly smaller projections are more accurate.

The Chancellor's Office has announced that Tier 1 cuts will be implemented as a deficit factor which means a one-time reduction and not a hit to our base funding. Tier 2 cuts will be implemented as a workload reduction of approximately 315 FTES which permanently reduces our base funding into future years.
