IV. Agenda:

A. Community College Growth Funding Formula

Vice-President Isomoto shared information with the committee regarding the Community College's Growth Funding Allocation Model. These calculations were developed by the Chancellor's Office Financial Workgroup in response to the trailer bill budget language. The five equally weighted factors are:

- 1. Educational Attainment (as measured by the individuals 25 years or older who do not have bachelor's degrees within a district's legal boundary)
- 2. Unemployment (as measured by the individuals 16 or older who are unemployed living within a district's legal boundary)
- 3. Poverty (as measured by attending students receiving a Pell grant)
- 4. Participation (as measured by the rate of enrolled students per 1,000 individual within a district's legal boundary)
- 5. Unfunded FTES (as measured by three prior years of unfunded FTES)

Using these factors, in 2015-2016, Santa Monica College would receive funding for a growth rate of 1.31%. Many districts that have high growth rates are actually currently shrinking. Much uncertainty remains about how this new formula will be implemented and how it will treat funding when districts fail to meet their target.

The Committee's next meeting will be held on January 21, 2015. The meetings schedule for December 17 and January 7 have been cancelled.
