- II. Public Comments Tracie Hunter, Associate Dean, Financial Aid was welcomed to the committee.

IV. Discussion/Reports

- a. Chris Bonvenuto gave a summary of FY 2019-2020 financial closing: District's total expenditures increased by ~\$13 million and the district's revenue did not increase.
- b. Adopted Budget Review Chris Bonvenuto presented the FY 2020-2021 Adopted Budget. The state will keep funding equal to FY 2019-2020 with the implementation of cash deferrals. There will be no COLA, No growth and No reductions. The adopted budget presented reflected decline in FTES and Nr FTES, the current deficit is ~ <\$7,537,485> with a projected Ending Fund Balance of ~\$13,503,270. Figures will most likely be adjusted between the September 16, 2020 Budget Committee meeting and October 6, 2020 when Chris Bonvenuto presents the 2020-21 Adopted Budget to the Board of Trustees.
 - 1) Issues moving forward: State financial health, Future revenue growth, New federal regulations for Non-resident tuition, Continued increase in costs, and Declining Fund Balance.
- c. MSI CARES Act Funding Survey Update: Tafari Alan, Elisa Meyer, Hannah Lawler, Nate Donahue and Chris Bonvenuto collaborated and created a survey that was sent to students, staff and faculty. Survey results will be shared during the next Budget Committee meeting.
