III. The minutes of the DPAC meeting on March 26, 2014 were accepted.

IV. Reports

A. Planning Subcommittees

- Budget Planning: Bob Isomoto and Howard Stahl, Co-Chairs. A primary topic of discussion
 was the student ID card fee. The subcommittee will continue to meet in anticipation of
 the release of the May revise, which should provide a clearer picture of the 2014-2015
 state budget.
- College Services Planning: Mike Tuitasi and Ty Moura, Co-Chairs. A motion was made to encourage double-sided printing by students. The subcommittee will be working with the Media Center on this effort.

- Facilities Planning: Greg Brown and Lee Peterson, Co-Chairs: The subcommittee discussed and approved a recommendation to amend Board Policy Section 2440 Smoke Free Campus. It is presented to DPAC for consideration in this agenda (see Agenda V A).
- Human Resources Planning: Sandy Chung and Patricia Burson, Co-Chairs: The subcommittee is working on the EEO plan.

C. Academic Senate Joint Committees

- Curriculum: Guido Davis Del Piccolo, Chair and Georgia Lorenz, Vice-Chair: The Curriculum Committee has approved an Associate in Science-Transfer (AS-T) degrees in Kinesiology and Geography. In addition new courses have been approved in Communication Studies and Interior Architectural Design.

- Institutional Effectiveness: Christine Schultz, Chair and Hannah Lawler, Vice-Chair: The committee will be presenting the Institutional Effectiveness Report/Dashboard to DPAC on April 23rd and to the Board of Trustees on May 6th.
- D. ACUPCC (American College and University President's Climate Committee): Earth Week is April 21-25 2014. The Eco Hero Awards on Thursday, April 24th 1-2 p.m. will honor the students who are managing the SMC organic learning garden, faculty member Gillian Grebler for her advocacy, and food vendor Beth Kimble. The Environmental Affairs Committee adopted a class schedule "flag" identifying green classes that meet ILO #4. The energy subcommittee is developing an energy management system for students to access energy data on buildings on campus (related to ILO #5). The transportation subcommittee is reviewing rideshare opportunities because of the loss of Zimride.

A. Recommendation from DPAC Facilities Subcommittee:

At the March 27, 2014 meeting of the DPAC Facilities Planning Subcommittee, the Subcommittee voted (9 in favor, 0 opposed, and 0 abstaining) to recommend that Board Policy 2440 be amended as follows (*italics* indicates new text; strikethrough indicates text to be deleted):

BP 2440 Smoke Free Campus

Santa Monica College is committed to providing a healthy, comfortable and productive environment, free from the effects of second-hand smoke *and vapor*, for its students, faculty and staff. Smoking *and the use of e-cigarettes or vaporizers is prohibited* shall not be permitted in any District buildings, vehicles or facility and facilities, or and on District grounds except in outdoor smoking areas designated by SMC Administrative Regulation 2440.

Reference: California Government Code Sections 7596-7598

Motion was made to amend the proposed revision as follows:

BP 2440 Smoke Free Campus

Santa Monica College is committed to providing a healthy, comfortable and productive environment, free from the effects of second-hand smoke *and vapor*, for its students, faculty and staff. Smoking <u>and the use of e-cigarettes or vaporizers is prohibited shall not be permitted</u> in <u>any District buildings</u>, vehicles <u>or facility</u> and facilities, <u>or and</u> on District grounds <u>except in designated outdoor smoking areas in accordance with SMC Administrative Regulation 2440.</u>

B. Updates

- Student Success and Support Program (SSSP) (formerly Matriculation) is a program
 that promotes and sustains the efforts of students to be successful in their
 educational endeavors. The Chancellor's Office is allocating additional funding for
 SSSP and has released guidelines on supportable activities. Those student-direct
 activities include admissions, orientation, assessment and testing, counseling and
 follow up.
- Student Equity Report: The Chancellor's Office has released guidelines for Student Equity Planning. Student equity plans focus on increasing access, course completion, ESL and basic skills completion, degrees, certificates and transfer for all students as measured by success indicators. A committee comprising representatives of college constituencies has been established to work on the report. Data will be used to identify populations impacted by issues of equal opportunity, and specific goals and activities will be developed to address gaps. The three-year plan is due in November and will need to be updated every year. The hope is that this is not just a task to complete, but will be a tool to address student equity on the campus. Additional funding proposed by the Governor will be included in the May revise.

- Emergency Preparedness/Safety: A task force was formed last year to look at
 emergency preparedness/safety issues on campus training, notification system,
 infrastructure. The task force has recently reviewed a report from consultants dealing
 with proposed infrastructure modifications (video cameras, locking/security
 mechanisms, etc.) and has developed a list of recommendations to be presented to
 senior staff for review. The task force is also developing a list of supplies needed for
 the college to be prepared for an emergency situation.
