



## AR 3434 Prohibition of Sexual Harassment Under Title IX

"Santa Monica Community College District (District) is committed to providing a respectful and inclusive academic and work environment free from unlawful sex discrimination in its education programs and activities consistent with Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 (Title IX). Under Title IX, sexual harassment, including sexual assault, dating violence, domestic violence, and stalking is unlawful sex discrimination."

# STOP Sex and gender discrimination, sex-based harassment, sexual assault, offensive behavior

## **Understanding sex discrimination**

**Sex discrimination** occurs when a person is treated unfavorably based on their actual or perceived sex, gender, gender identity or expression, or sexual orientation. Sex discrimination can be experienced by anyone. Sexual harassment, sexual assault, and gender based harassment are all forms of sex discrimination.

**Sexual assault** is sexual contact with another person without that person's consent. It also includes intimate partner violence (domestic & dating violence), stalking, and other forms of sexual misconduct.

**Sexual harassment** is unwelcome language or conduct of a sexual nature. The behavior is sufficiently severe, pervasive and objectively offensive such that it could create an intimidating, hostile, or offensive environment or impact an individual's academic or work performance.

**Gender-based harassment**, or discriminatory harassment based on sex, is unwelcome or derogatory language or behavior that is motivated by gender, gender expression or gender identity.

**Consent** is voluntary and freely given and can be withdrawn at any time.

Title IX prohibits discrimination on the basis of **pregnancy**, **childbirth**, **recovery**, and other similar and related conditions. Pregnant and parenting individuals may be entitled to support, protections, and/or accommodations under Title IX and other federal and state laws.

SMC prohibits **retaliation** against any person for reporting, cooperating in an investigation or participating in the complaint resolution process, and/or for exercising their rights under SMC policy.

# WHAT IS TITLE IX? No sex discrimination. No sexual assault. *Period*.



If you are uncomfortable with behavior you have experienced or observed, or are unsure if it could constitute sex based harassment, **ask for help** from an instructor, counselor, supervisor, colleague, friend, or another person you trust.
